## About CRIRSCO

CRIRSCO (Committee for Mineral Reserves International Reporting Standards) was formed in 1994 under the auspices of the Council of Mining and Metallurgical Institutes (CMMI). It is a grouping of representatives of organisations that are responsible for developing mineral reporting codes and guidelines in Australasia (JORC), Canada (CIM), Chilean Mining Commission, Europe (PERC), South Africa (SAMREC) and the USA (SME).

The international initiative of CRIRSCO is to Standardise market-related reporting definitions for mineral resources and mineral reserves, with the primary objective of developing a set of International standard definitions for the reporting of mineral resources and mineral reserves.
