



Managing perceptions of working groups Maintaining Interest in light of governance and tenure issues



- Reporting of inferred mineral resources
- Reporting standards and format of mineral resources
- Competent persons and registration
- Independence
- Exploration results
- CRIRSCO's revised Reporting requirements.



- Scope should be limited to Mineral and directly related mining assets
- Definitions directly related to valuation (such as value, market value, book value etc)
- Guiding principles/values mandatory vs guidance
- Fundamental principles include transparency, materiality, competence and reasonableness.
- Profile of the valuator, competency definition, qualifications, registration, reciprocity and discipline
- Alignment with international developments.

- Adopted the NI51-101 standards
- Still to finalised and ratified
- Fracing Issue in RSA

- Initiative started to review the code
- Meeting held with VALMIN/JORC
- Umbrella body still an issue



- Meeting 17 April 2012
- SAMVAL to represent Extractive Industry Perspective at IVSC
- International Harmonization Group, known at this stage as the "Brisbane Accord"





- Last edition 2007
- Proposal to publish update of SAMREC in 2013
- Critical path is the completion of all the issue papers
